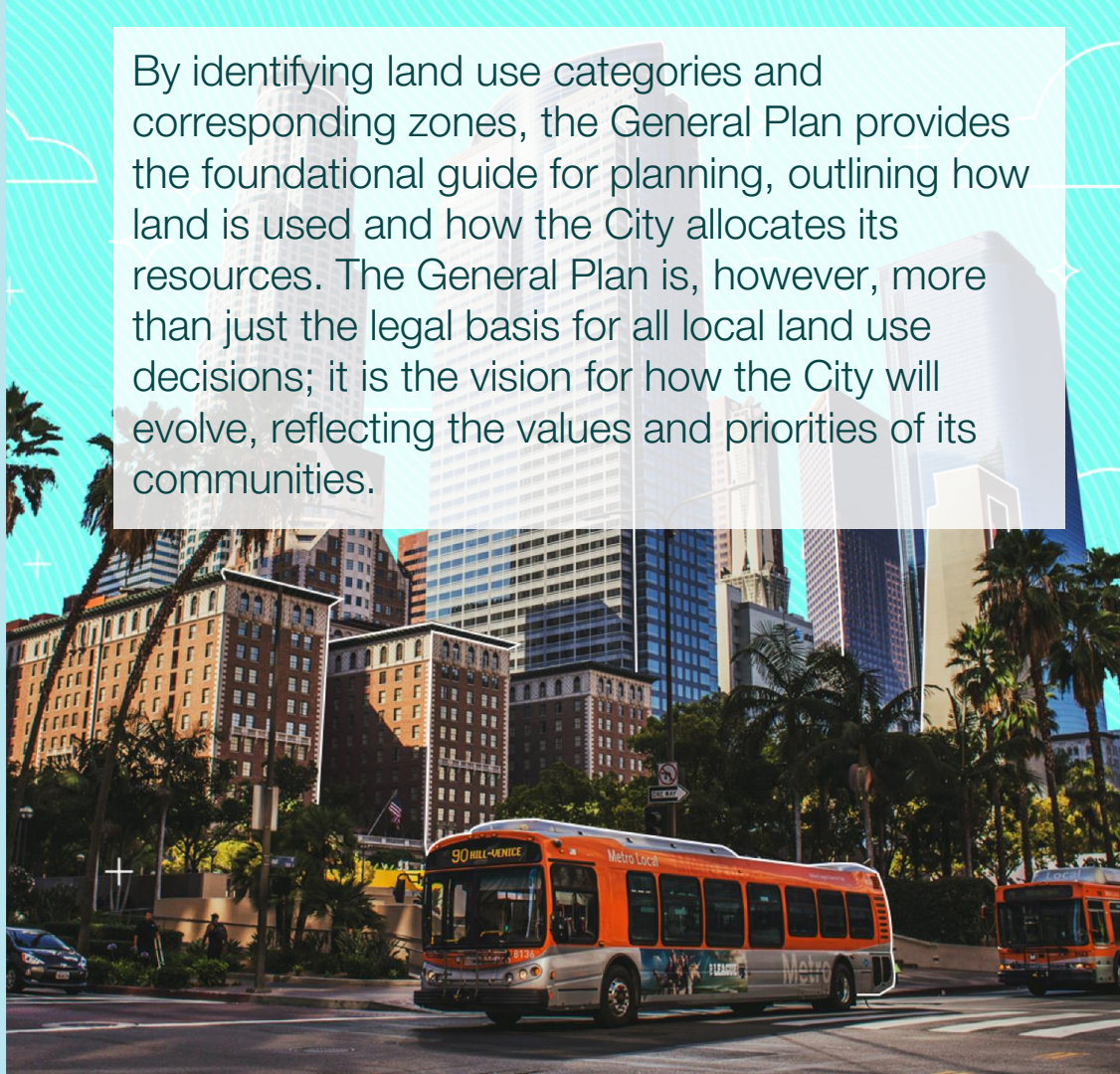

# L.A. - EXISTING HELIPORT APPROVAL PROCESS

This process assumes liability and risk mitigation associated with traditional helicopters operating at a low tempo of operations to reduce exposure to incidents, noise, and emissions.

Current policy language is inclusive only to helicopters, helistops, heliports, and emergency helicopter landing facilities. New policy must be inclusive of eVTOLs and other emerging aircraft & infrastructure types.

A vertiport network (more than one vertistop or vertiport) will require a land use policy and applicable environmental clearance.

Policy work must be initiated AND RESOURCED by City Council
